Research Agenda under NACP-III

To position NACO as the leading national body, promoting and coordinating research on HIV/AIDS nationally through:

- developing guidelines, norms and standards for undertaking HIV/AIDS research;
- partnerships and networking with multiple stakeholders and established national academic and other research institutions;
- supporting capacity building in social, clinical & biomedical, basic and operational research related to HIV/AIDS and allied subjects;
- functioning as the central repository of all relevant resources, research documents and data base on HIV/AIDS in the country; and
- ensuring translation of research outputs into programmatic action and policy formulation.

Key Activities

- Setting Priority Areas for Evaluation & Operational Research (E&OR) in HIV/AIDS & Development of Research Protocols.
- 2. Encouraging, Processing & approving Research Proposals.
- Coordinating activities of Technical Resource Group (TRG) on Research & Development and NACO Ethics Committee(EC)
- 4. Dissemination of HIV/AIDS Research Outcomes.
- 5. Network of Indian Institution for HIV/AIDS Research (NIIHAR)
- 6. Capacity Building Initiatives including NACO Research Fellowship Scheme (NRFS) for MD/ M.Phil/ Ph.D students

Identifying Priority Areas for E&OR

- Discussions with officers managing different programme components at NACO and SACS – identify key information gaps & generate draft list.
- List shared with partner agencies and other external stakeholders.
- Also discussed in various Technical Resource Groups.
- Deliberated in Technical Consultations with experts in the respective fields & major research institutions.
- Under NACP-III the list was first prepared in 2008. Currently being updated.

Technical Resource Group on Research & Development

- Is an expert group that advises NACO on the broad policy & strategy for promoting HIV/AIDS Research in India.
- Provides Technical inputs and recommendations.
- Monitors progress and reviews interim as well as final outcomes of Research initiatives.
- Also advises NACO in fulfilling its research agenda.
- Comprises of experts in diverse disciplines. Chaired by Prof. Ranjit Roy Chaudhury.
- Meets once in three months or as required.

NACO Ethics Committee

Consists of multidisciplinary experts. In addition, a legal expert and a representative from the community are also included.

Basic Responsibility

- To protect the dignity, rights and well being of the potential research participants.
- To ensure that universal ethical values and international scientific standards are expressed in terms of local community values and customs.
- To assist in the development and the education of a research community responsive to local health care requirements

Through a series of reviews & discussions, has developed the 'National Guidelines on Ethics for Research on HIV/AIDS'.

Dissemination of HIV/AIDS Research Outcomes

National Conference on HIV/AIDS Research (19-21 January 2011, India Habitat Centre (IHC), New Delhi)

- "Towards Evidence-Policy linkages in HIV/AIDS Research".
- Around 300 abstracts were received:
 - 31 oral presentations; and
 - 60 poster presentations

- Four main thematic areas of the conference:
 - Basic Sciences
 - Clinical and Biomedical
 - Socio-Behavioural
 - Evaluation studies

Preceded by a **Pre-Conference Continuing Education Workshop** (18th January 2011, IHC, New Delhi)

- "HIV/AIDS Research: Challenges & Perspectives"
- Presentations on 12 key Research Priority Areas by eminent experts.

National Conference on HIV/AIDS Research – New Delhi (19-21 January 2011)



Network of Indian Institutions for HIV/AIDS Research (NIIHAR)

- Constituted to facilitate and undertake HIV/AIDS research.
- Main functions :
 - i. Sharing resources and expertise to conduct high quality, collaborative, multi-centric research;
 - ii. Participation in training and capacity building programs.
 - iii. Deputation of experts to NACO as short-term consultants based on specific requirements.
- Presently 42 institutions are members of the NIIHAR Consortium

Capacity Building Initiatives

NACO Research Fellowship Scheme (NRFS)

- <u>Eligibility Criteria</u>: Students enrolled for MD/M.Phil/PhD in relevant disciplines; Upper Age limit: 35 years.
- Component of Grant: 20 fellowships awarded every year.; Grant Range: ₹ 30,000 – 1.5 lakhs.
- Procedure for Approving Proposals:
 Academic Record, Quality of Protocol & Academic
 Achievements of candidate
